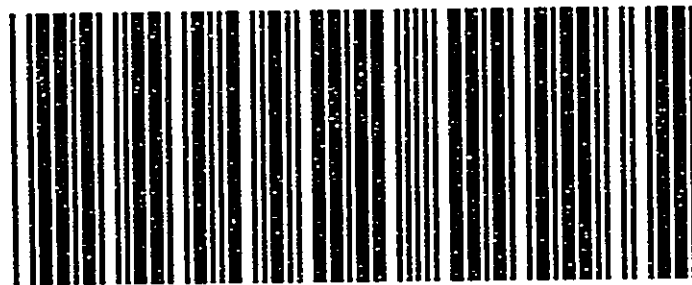

There were only two Morgans in B.Co. - one landed as a Cpl. but was soon made Sgt. and he was killed on 19.5.15. at Lone Pine, in Victoria Gully. I saw his body, went to his funeral and helped fix up his grave on the side of Victoria Gully. There was a cross on his grave with his name on the cross. He was about 5 ft.9 or 10, dark, fairly thick set and 22 years of age. The other Morgan was a Pte. rather elderly, about 5 ft.11, very thick set, with a heavy dark moustache, and he is still with the original 2nd.Bn; and I saw him last in Egypt at Tel el Kobir until the Bn. was split up in April or March last. There were only these two Morgans in B.Co. The Pte. Morgan only joined us about 14 days before we left and he had a high number. The Morgan who was killed had a low number, somewhat similar to mine. They were both in original B. Co. and were put into B.Co. when the regiment was formed into 4 Cos. and platoons at Monah Camp. I am quite sure of the above. HSO.

The Morgan who was a Pte. was wounded just after the landing and left the Peninsula but got back in time for the attack on Lone Pine in Aug. I am quite sure of this. HSO.
