PTE. N. ROSS

Mrs. W. Ross, of Denison, Gippsland, has received advice that her son, No. 2248 Pte. N. Ross, 14th Battalion, has been awarded the Military Medal for bravery in the field. Pte. Ross has been missing since April 11, 1917. He has two brothers on active service. One, Pte. W. Ross, is in hospital in London recovering from wounds. The other, Pte. J. Ross, who left Australia with the 14th Battalion, is still at the front.
