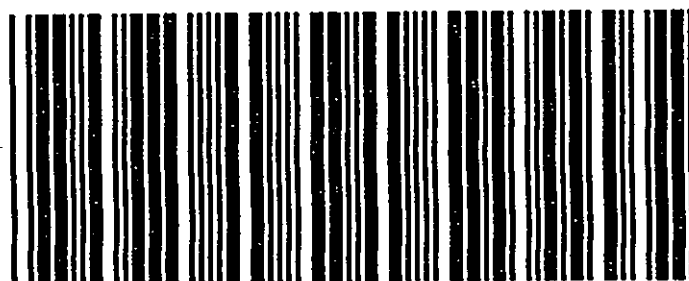

Informant, who was in the same platoon, declared that Ross was missing. He was a popular man and much enquiry made for him at the time. If dead, he should have been found, for it happened before the armistice when both sides went out to bring the dead. Also it was in the day time that Ross was missed. For these reasons the informant believed that he was a prisoner.
