I was with its. Forcy Scutt of the 33rd batthe, D 30., 13th 21th. He was in the satialion Sond and a strutcher bearer. No were in the old "no mene land" at Flugatriat Wood between our old front line and the new one which we had taken the day before - June 7th, 1917. We were on a read in the open when a shell appleded in the middle of the party and Soutt was worthally wounded. Pter Collert attached to the Battalion Hilifery Folice and Stratcher Bearer Fallace, Battalion Bendeman, carried South back. He died of wounds and would be Suprised buried in Plagatract Venetery.

I believe his initials were P.J. He was one of our Bandsmen, and came from a place called Bingare. My playcon Sergeant, Sgt Burns, told me that Soutt was helping to carry a stretcher on June Sth when a shell exploded and knocked him off the end of the stretcher. He was badly hurt and died while being taken to the D/S. I don't know where he was buried.

Percy Scutt was in C.Coy in the band. He was also a reserve S/B. His number was something like 1972. He was the only man called Scutt in the company. Before joining up he was a motor driver at Warialda in N.S.W. I was told by S/B Honey that a party of about 8 S/Bs including Honey and Scutt went out to fetch in the wounded and whilst they were doing this a shell fell amongst them and killed two or three of the S/Bs. and dangerously wounded Scutt, who died of his wounds a day or two afterwards. This occurred between the 7th and loth June at Messines. I do not know where Scutt was buried.

McGuire told me this a couple of months ago.
