

K. Sept. 21st, 1917. Det. D/B.

This was at Glencorse Wood, Ypres, on the morning of Sept. 20th not 21st. We were waiting for our barage to start before advancing, and Fritz put up his before ours begain. Robinson and two or three more took shelter under a great pile of timbor, end two or three shells lended on it blowing them all up in amongst the timber. There was no possibility of burial; they were all blown to small pieces. I know this for a fact because I thied to get into the timber myself them, but get caught in the wire and couldn't.

Robinson was in my section, C.XII. His people live at North Dandeloys, S.W.Railway, Bunbury Line, W. Australia. Activity

In answer to your enquiry about -

who is reported Missing since 21-9-17, we would suggest that the quickest method for you to obtain news concerning him would be to keep in touch with our office in Perth with wich we are in constant communication both by letter and cable. It is an unnecessary delay to communicate with this office when the news for which you are applying may be already at our local branch. Should his name appear on the list of prisoners in Germany, parcels of food are at once sant by our Prisoners of war Department without delay, so you need have no anxiety that your son will be in need of parcels. We foar we cannot raise your hopes for his cafety as so many months have passed already since the assualty occurred. Any information we get will be at once sent on to our Perth office.

Pte. H.C. Robinson, 11th Battn. A.I.F. we regret to inform you of an anofficial report about him which we have received from one of the men in his unit.

6081a I/Cpl. C.H. Parker interviewed recently at 55th Gen. Hospital B.E.F. stated that at Glencorse Wood Ypres on Sept. 20th they were waiting to advance, where the enemy anticipated our barrage and started shelling first. Pte. Robinson with several others took shelter under a pile of timber, when unfortunately a shell explosed which turied them under the timber killing them instantly and precluded any possibility of extricating the bodies. Our Inf. tried to do so, but found it quite impossible.
