

"Died of Wounds 1-4-18"

Robinson was wounded by an aerial bomb at Maricourt and died at or just before reaching the 10th A. dressing station, Bomnay, and is buried at the Cemetery attached to a A.D.S. at Bonnay, and Cross put up. I saw him when wounded and later saw his dead body.

I returned from Blighty leave on 4th. April. I heard Robinson had been killed, and I saw his grave at Bonnay. A cross was erected bearing all particulars. I knew him slightly in my unit. I have his name in my diary as killed. (Diary produced)

"Died of Wounds 1-4-18"

Robinson was wounded by a bomb at Heilly while he was stretcher bearing, getting the full issue, being badly knocked all over the body, and dying at the advanced dressing station. Bounay. I carried him out after he was dead. He is buried in the new Cemetery at Hounay, being the second man to be buried there.

I knew him well. He belonged to the same S/B squad. He came from West Australia was about 41, had ginger hair, and was clean shaven at the date of deaththough he had a mountache when he came over. He was married with three children. About the let April mear Mericourt he was going up with another to take over from another pair. It was early in the morning and an aeroplane dropped 2 bombs; He was hit in the side., taken back to the D/Station and died there. I saw him being taken down on a stretcher. He is buried at Bonney I believe.
