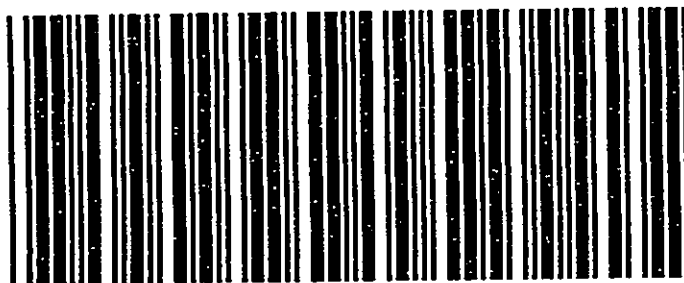

Witness says he saw Shearston's body lying in one of the trenches near the Gurka's lines. His next of kin is Shearston, at the Royal Naval House in Grosvenor House, Sydney.

Witness saw Shearston in a kind of sitting position near a dug-out near the stubble-field at Hill 60 about 2 p.m. on Sunday, 22/8/15.

Witness looked him over but there was no movement, he touched him and, although, he could see no wound, he was dead. Witness knew him, both of them having joined the Battalion shortly before it embarked. Shearston came from Sydney and was a ship's stoward. They did not bring in his body. It was a rough position.
