He was a Presbyterian and was seen and buried by Mr Alexander the Presbyterian minister who is away on sick leave. Pte Madden was here many months with a wound in his head. He is buried in Heilly Cemetery and a cross marks his grave. No doubt Mr. Alexander has written to his people in Sydney.

HADDEN 1/Cpl. T.R. 4859

Died of Wounds 28.11.16.

Informant and "Tom" Hadden were both wounded on the same day. Informant saw the stretcher-bearers carrying him away. He had been severely wounded in the head by a fragment of high explosive shell. This was on 1st November, near Comblès -- about a mile from Bapaume.

Hadden was short, thick-set, young, dark, and had been an engine-driver.

Madden was wounded on the 31/10/16 near Montauban on the Somme in the head. He was taken to Anzac Dressing Station and then on to 36th Casualty Clearing Station, where he died on the 28/11/16. He is buried in a British Cemetery at Heilly.

the back. He was unconscious most of the time that
he was here. He died about 24 hours after admission.

him once & just found his head. Mr. C. H. Piece never
spoke of it.
