Dear Madam .

With reference to your
enquiry regarding Lt. Rolph
43 Brit. Machine Guns.

"Missing 23. 3. 18." we beg to
inform you that we had
the name of Lt J. Rolph
14 batt M. G. C. (late 42 Coy) on
our lists as being missing
since April 19th. Information
was subsequently received
that this officer was a
prisoner of war at Ingoldstadt.

We notice that your
enquiry was received by
cable and wonder if
possibly some mistake may
have been made in the date
of the casualty and number
of battalions. The only other
Lt. J. Rolph shown in the Army
list is in the R. A. F. and
we have no enquiry for
any Lt. Rolph missing on
March 23rd.
