near Bernafay Woods. Particulars of burial not known.

Dear Sir, we have ~~received~~ a letter from Mrs Moore of Melbourne respecting her brother Pte. T. F. Moore. 3073. 14th Austral. Batt, reported killed in action in France. Can you inform us whether the above mentioned soldier was killed 'within' the British lines. If so, can you supply any information or particulars on the subject? If, on the other hand, he is ^{not} reported to have been killed within these lines, but is believed to have been buried in enemy country, will you kindly inform us that we may make enquiries on the subject on behalf of his family.

Who are naturally anxious for details. His sister
does not state the above facts in her letter, & in order
to avoid delay, we are writing direct to you.

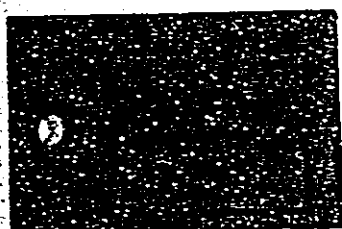
