Both in my Pltn. 16 of D.Coy. We 3 had lost our Ba tn. in the mix up and went to Bgde.H.Qrs. for its whereabouts. We were waiting in a dug-out for information when a shell struck us by which Maloney was killed and I lost my arm. I had to be dug out but I feel sure Atkinson was buried too and probably killed because I heard them say there was a fellow under me and I knew he was hit by this shell.

Maloney was killed alongside of me at Polygon Wood. Three of us, Maloney (in same section as I) on my right, Atkinson on my left, were seated on a form at Brigade Head Quarters when a shell exploded and

I fell on my right side. I cannot say of my own knowledge that he was killed but all of us being buried by a cement dug out which was blown in on top of us were being dug out and I heard one man say "There's another man right underneath him (meaning the informant Smith) and we cannot get him out" I believe the man referred to was Maloney as I fell on top of him. I went away and know nothing further. I have made a statement concerning Atkinson.
