N/July 19-20th. 1916.

I knew Samuels; he was on the Lawis Jun; also EcDonald, and EcDonald told me he saw Semuels hit in the arm early in the evening of 19.7.16 at Flaurbaix, and he carried on in the 3rd. line of German tranches all that night, and he advised Semuels to come back to our tranch. EcDonald told me that Semuels paybook was handed in to R. Samuels of me that Semuels paybook was handed in to R. Samuels of B. 54 Bn. a brother of 1/Opl.A.E.Samuels. The latter was a L/Opl. and we called him "Alf"; his other initial was "E".
