"Died of wounds"

In reply to your letter. I beg to report that Pte. Miller was admitted here on 21.9.17. from No 6 Ambulance Train after passing through No 10 Casualty Clearing station suffering from a severe gun shot wound of the left upper arm. He was wounded on 20.9.17. and examination showed a compound fracture of the left Humerus. Three operations were performed at this Hospital on the 1st, 17th and 31st October. He gradually got worse, and died in this Hospital November 1st at 5.10.p.m. He was buried the following day in the British Military Cemetery at Etaples, and his personal effects, if any, were forwarded to the effects branch G.H.Q. 3rd Echelon, for transmission to the next of kin in letter from O.C.

In reply to your letter on reverse, I beg to report that Pte.
