

"Capt. Moule was wouned in the abdomen by several Machine Gun bullets and was carried to the Casualty Clearing Station at Poperinghe where he died on Oct. 6th. He would be buried in a cemetary near there. I got this information from Lt. J.W. Macdonald of my Battn. who was in the next bed to him at the same clearingstation. He had been operated on and seemed to do well at first, but siddenly died of Collapse. He was a charming man and the most popular in the Battn. absolutely fearless and a great loss."

He was O.C. of C.Company. So had thopped the bugs at a me, on the 4th October at Brodseinde Ridge and had got no more than 100 yards when I saw him hit by a shell full in the body He got half a shell to himself and was done for at once. I carried him 200 or 300 yards and he told me to gut him down as he did not think he could live long. I laid him in a shell hale. He lived about 20 minutes and died then. He is buried in this shell hale on Brodseinde Ridge. It was too bad to put up anything to mark it. There was a barrage on day and night.


