It was at Buire near Albert, that Milner was killed by one of our own shells felling short. I was in the same trench about 25 yards away. He was killed outright, as also was Pte. Edwards, and Cpl. Ward was wounded. I saw him carried away, dead, on a stretcher. I did not see his grave, but I did see the cross that was got ready. It was inscribed with his name and regimental no. He was in my co. - C - and the same pltn. We joined the battn. in France together about the 18th Nov. 1916. He'd been in hospital once, I remember, but never wounded. He was a good lad.

He was killed by one of our own shells which fell short while having his breakfast in a trench at the right of the Albert-Amiens Road. Two others were killed and I wounded at the same time. I helped to carry him to H.QK and he was buried in a small cemetery on the side of the Amiens-Albert Road about 2 kilometers behind the line.
