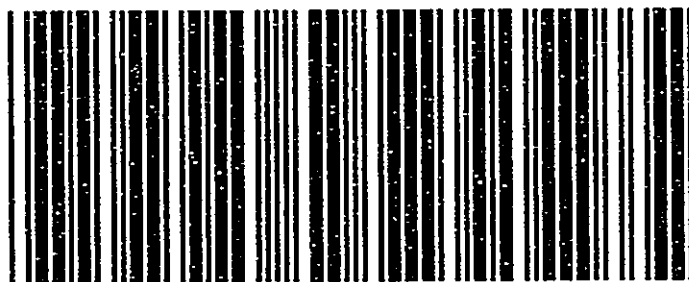

I left Melbourne on S.S. Warilda February 8th 1916.
with a Jim Morrissey - who had been at Gallipoli and had re-
joined. I was with him in France. He was a Sergeant. I
got knocked November 11th 1916 and can remember nothing about
Morrissey. On August 26th 1916. - I met Cpl (Battn 21. Coy
A.98th Reinforcements) at Horseferry Road, about month ago
ago. He told me that Morrissey had returned to Australia. He was el-
derly, tall, clean shaven, medium build.
