## "Killed in Action" 5-11-17.

Mewburn (a Lewis Gunner) was killed by a whizz bang which lobbed right on top of him on an cutpost in Passchendaele. the evening before the Canadians took the village. He was not k killed outright but had a leg taken off by the shell but only lived a short while, dying before reaching a D/S. He was hit about ll.p.m. and died smiling. I saw him wounded being in charge of outpost. We were having a very hot time but he was buried at night I'm pretty sure though I can't say where. The ground was held.

On the 5th Nov. at Yores on the ridge near "Ancac House" we were in tranches on outpost duty and just holding on against heavy etcoks. Newburn and I were in the same piece of tranch with 9 or 10 other men when at 9 p.m. about a howster shell burst in our tranch. Newburn's leg was shattored right up to the hip and was only just hanging on. Some 3/Bs took him down to a D/3 Year by and one of them to 1d me he died on the way and was conscious to the leat. I don't know where he was buried but it must have been somewhere close by as the enemy sholling was too heavy to take him far. He was about 19, and strong, well built. 5 ft.S. I know nothing of his previous history.

Vil. and I heard that he d/Wounds before reaching the D/Station and they said that they buried him in our support line. Fitzgereld will know the location of the grave.


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

### "Killed 5-11-17"

He was of B.Coy. In front of Ypres, behind Passcheddaele on 5th Nov. he was killed by shell whilst in front line. He had his leg blown off and died on the stretcher. I helped to carry him out, was inconscious. He was buried about 100 yds. from old Coy. Hqts., about 500 yds. behind post where he was hit. I saw his grave, it is on the bank of a communication trench. Small Cross erected. I knew him as M. Hewburn. He was a L.Gunner.

He was unfortunately burried in a whell hole marked by a rifle. He was not in possesion of a pay Book but had an identification dive which I left on him . Re Mc 2013. Pte.A.G.E. Mewburn. B.Ccy. 17th Battalicn. I beg to inform tou that during the execution of my duties as streacher bearer. I saw fully the regrettable case of Hewburn. It was at about 11.p.m. on the night of Movember 5th when Newburn with others were in a suggest, heavily reinforced by heavy wood, when the enemy obtained a direct hit on the dugout with a 5.9.H.E.shell, and a fragment of shell amputated his left leg about 6 inches below the thigh. He also had an artery out in right leg and had a great amount of debris on his body. During the time we took to extricate him in bed weather and darkness, he hasmorrhage had set in severely. I endeavoured to stop bleeding but every effort was is vain, and he was toing taken to the Doctor when he died and was haried by me of the litterpection of the Communication sap and the Front line of the 17th Battalion on Tokic Ridge. He was unfortuately buried in a shell hole marked by a rifle. He was not in possession of a pay book but had an identification disc which I left on him.
