"I was told by a stranger (whose name I do not know) that he had been ine Hospital with Sergt Holan (58 B.) et Boulogne. We told me that Sergt Bolan had been hit in the shoulder and in the thigh, and that he had passed away quietly one morning, quite unexpectedly. They did not realise that he was so ill. He was very cheerful up to the last. I know that he was the coelest man under fire, and was very cheerful after he was wounded, when he was going away."

Eye-witness: Ho, told by a stranger from Boulogne, see above.

Description: Very big, tall, fine, a splendidly made, 6° 14 stone a footballer, we called him Bill

He was hit in the groin at Fleurs-Baix on July 23rd, He was very badly wounded. I did not see him hit, but got details from C.S.M. H.Stubbs.B.Coy. 58th. Battn. and further information can be had from him.

Re your enquiry of 520la Sgt. Tilliam, Holan reported died of wounded wounds 25.7.16. I may state that I know him personally. We enlisted together and remained together until 19th. July when he received his wounds. I was C.S.H. of the Coy. at the time we attacked the enemy trenches. He went over in the first wave with myself, unfortunately he did not get far when he received two bullet wounds, one in the shoulder, the other high up in the thigh. He was conveyed to Hospital finally reaching Boulogne where he succumbed to he wounds. He was buried in Boulogne Hilitary Cometery, his grave Ho. is 559l As for description, height 6ft. wellbuilt, hair dark, eyes blue I might add that there is no doubt of his identity, as we went to school together and have been together ever since.
