A dump - Souvenir Dump - of ammunition at Messines was exploded by a shell causing 25 casualties, 19 deaths, 16 outright. These (including the two Williamsons) were buried together at a cemetery just close to the dump. A big headstone was prepared ready for erection, but we were not allowed to put it up. I helped to bury them. Other's names I remember are, Sadler, Plush, Mantell, Davis, Wealand, D.Williams, & Hassall.
