

I knew a man called Moore in B Co. 5th pltn. who was killed
on the 12th Aug. in our first attack at Pozieres. He was
killed by the concussion of a shell which burst near him
in our front line. His body was blown over the parapet.
He came from Balingup, W. Australia; was between 28 and 30
5ft. 7, dark hair, fresh complexion. I do not know his
regimental number or initials but he came over with the
12th reinforcements.

He was in 3 Co., 5th Pltn. On the 12th August we were in the trenches opposite Mougnet Farm. A shell exploded in the trench and blew him and a Pte. Farrady out on to the parade. We were relieved in that trench soon afterwards so I do not know whether their bodies were buried.
