"Missing Aug. 5th 1916"

Witness states that he received a letter from an H.A. Norman, No. 1711, 22nd Battalion, about 5th December. This Norman was then pay-sergeant, Staples.
Description. Tall, about 5ft. 10 ins, 22 years old but looks 18, slight, fair. When he enlisted he lived at St. Kilda, his people now at Sandringham, Victoria. Came in 2nd Reinforcements, did not know any other Norman in battalion.

Informant was in the front trench when the Battn. was relieved after the Pozieres attack and was close to Norman. They left about 5 or 6 p.m. reaching "Sausage Gully" about 2 hrs. later where they spent the night. Norman was then Missing. Informant says he saw Norman just before leaving, the way they went was being fairly heavily shelled. One man was slightly wounded just behind Informant as they left the trench. Norman was in A Coy.
