"I knew Pte. Frank Murton. He was in my Coy, and Pltn. Near Fleurs my Mattalion charged the German trench about 7 o'clock in the morning of the 14th November 1916. On reaching the German first lins I was wounded in the right knee. I crawled back to our line and on my way I saw Pte. Murton lying on the ground dead. He had evidently been struck by a piece of a shell on the side of the head and neck. I looked at him closely and I could see that he was dead. I do not know where he was buried."

I knew Pte. Frank Murton, He was in my Coy. and "Plateon Sear Fleure my Battelion charged the German " tranch about 7 c'eleck in the morning of the 14th " Hov. 1916. On reaching the Cerman First line I was " wounded in the right knee. I crawled back to our " line and on my way I saw Pte. Eurten lying on the " ground dead. He had evidently been struck by a piece " of shell on the side of the head and meck. I looked " at him closely and I could see that he was dead. I " do not knew where he was buried."
