"Died of wounds"

I beg to say that this patient was admitted in the afternoon of Thursday Oct 25th suffering from gun shot wounds of face and neck and fractured lower jaw. He asked to smoke but was very dazed and appeared not very rational, and was quite unable to give any account of himself or of his friends. During the night he appeared to have a good deal of pain and he was still dazed. On the 26th his condition was much the same he was X rayed. On Saturday the 27th he was very drowsy all day at 5.30.p.m. an anaesthetic was given, he was restless the first part of the night but after midnight unconsciousness deepened, respiration became laboured, and he remained in this condition throughout Sunday until he died at 6.5. p.m. Pte. McGregor was buried at Brookwood. I sent these particulars to his sister in Scotland to forward to his mother in Australia.
