I knew Frank for about eighteen months before he transferred to the "Divvy Train". He was in the same troop as me while he was with the 6th. It must have been twelve months after he left us that we heard about Frank's death. He died at Rafa on the 7th November 1918 and is buried at the Military Cemetery, Gaza. Frank was a big man about 14 stone, dark and I think he came from off the Riverina in N.S.W. He was a very quiet going chap - one of the best of soldiers 9 all in the 6th that knew him were extremely sorry to hear of his death. I am enclosing a negative of his grave which was taken by Vic. Lavener, A. Squadron, 6th L.H.
