Chalmers and Mc Guinness, both "early" Sydney men and Ncel Tidswell 31st Rits leaving about Christmas 1917 were hit by the same shell while going into the line with the Battalion, in support of Villers Bretonneux front. The Corporals are buried in official cemetery on Villers Bretonneux road, out of Camen. Graves of Chalmers and Mc Guinness are done up with railings and crosses put up and photos taken by Sgt.Chapman.I. 18th Battn Transports from whom copies may be got.

The A.M.C. Cpl of 18th Battn - don't know name- told me Tidswell's legs were badly damaged that he was sent to a D/S but died, but I can't say as to his burial. Tidswell's brother is in 18th Battn still.

Informant thought dates were 18th Battn. D.Cc. Hut 18.WESTHAM. about 18th July but Tidswell's death is recorded in C/L 3-7-16 as 29th June at the 47th C.C.S.
