"I believe Mechan was killed. He was in the rear of the Platoon, coming out of the trenches after Flers, about November last, when a shell burst, one man was slightly wounded, and Mechan was never seen again. The general opinion was that he had been killed."

A party of about 20 men were making back to Carlton Camp after being relieved in the trenches near Mers. Set. Meehan was bringing up the rear. They were in struggling order, siagle file, informent being in the front lot. A shell burst in the rear and wounded being in the front lot. We were just leaving the trenches at Flers on our way to Carlton Camp, when a shell broke over the rear which he was bringing up. The Bettn, not knowing what had really happened, continued on. When we arrived at Brigade H.Q. it was reported that he was missing, and a search party returned, but no trace of him could be found. The reason that the men near him did not give information earlier was that it was night, and they - suffering from concession - really did not know. The general conclusion is that he was blown to pieces. We all felt it very much, as he was a splendid fellow, and a good friend to everyone of us.
