Mundy was in the 10th Bde.Sec. of the 3 Div.Sig.Co. He was wounded in the head by a piece of gas shell which struck him just on the temple. None of us thought it was a bad wound, but it must have been poisoned and he died afterwards, I think at the C.C.S. I know nothing about his burial. I helped to put him into the stretcher. He was a dark, thin-faced chap about 27 or 28 and married. He was somewhat slight and fairly tall. I think he came from W.A.

Mundy was hit by a piece of gas shell and the wound was very slight - only a scratch on the temple; it was not what you might call a "knock". Everyone was astonished when we heard that he had died. Two or three others were wounded but no one else died. We were all together when he was hit. He died at Vignacourt C.C.S. He has a brother in the Aust. Corps Sig. Coy. and this brother has been amongst us making enquiries, and I am certain that he knows all that there is to be known.
