"Died of wounds 5.10.17"

I saw him wounded on the Menin Road. He was caught by pieces of shell, which hit him about the head and legs. He was taken away to the dressing station near by, and was then in a conscious condition. He was carrying ammunition at time of casualty. I do not know anything further of him, but refer to Bdd. L.R. Brown, 110 Howitzer Battery, who is now in France. He is the battery clerk and can give all details.

Pte.Thomas was very severely wounded. He had shrapnel in the brain and latterly a cerebral abscess formed, he was also wounded on the right arm. He was quite unconscious for some days before he died. Sister wrote fully to his father after the poor boy died.
