

## K. in Action 7/8/15. Details.

There was a corporal and Private Villes in the 1st Light
Horse Regiment. Pte. Villas was the first men in the regiment
to be killed inthe charge on Pope's Hill at half past four in
the morning of the 7th August. Witness saw Villas almost
instantaneously killed just after quitting the trenches. The
body was one of those that was unrecoverable and was to be seen
lying out in front of the trench.
