I saw him killed just on the left of Polygan Wood near Ypres. He was caught by a bullet, which entered his mouth, and travelled right through his head, killing him instantly. I knew him well, he came away from Australia with me by the S.S. "Marathan" Troop-ship "A74" which left there on the 28.10.16. He used to always sign himself "Payne" but I am sure he is the man referred to in the enquiry list, be-cause I know his number and initials well, and also the date of casualty. I buried him in the field just to the left of Polygan Wood and I marked his grave with his rifle to which I fastened his indentity disc. to which I fastened his indentity diso.
