"In Suffolk Avenue, Le Bissie (?) Sector between Ploegsteert and Armentieres we were working on a gum emplacement in a trench, before dinner. The chemy shelled us out, and Tucker was blown to bits as we hopped into a communication trench. I was within a yard of him, also a can named West, but we were not touched. He was buried by 43 Pioneers. Lt: Porter, now Capt: saw about it."

I did not see him hit, nor did I see his grave, but was told he was buried in the Military Cemetery behind Ploegsteert Wood. I cannot remember the man's name who told, nor can I refer to anyone for further information ther information.

I was told Bert Tucker was hit with a Wizz Bang, death instancous at Messins, he was a Lewis Gunner and was in action. I was 'in the line the same time he was killed about a 100 yards away but did not see the casualty, cannot remember the man's name who told me, he saw him killed, but was told he was fearfully knocked about quite sure he was killed, we were great friends and left Australia together I believe he was buried at the Armentieres Cemetery, ground held, no other of same name in battalion, cannot refer to anyone for further information.
