

On 19th July 1916, at Flourbaix, Private Tedford was killed by shrapnel at about twenty past six. He was a little short and a dark chap. Had brother in same battalion. Informant is intelligent,

I only knew 2 Tedfords in the 31st.Batt. One of them.W.E.Tedford.No.78, is now wounded in England, and I have heard from my son who was with him in hospital. The other Tedford transferred from the 25th.to 31st. They were both in the Band. I saw the latter Tedford lying out dead in No Man's Land at Fleurbaix on the morning of 20.7.16. I was quite close to him as I was locking for my son and am quite sure it was Tedford and that he was dead. This man was about 5 ft.6 or 7 ins. fair, thick-set. He came from Maryborough, Queensland. and was a brother of W.E.Tedford.

"About No.2012 P.A.Tedford, A.Cox, 31st Battn. On the night of July 19th, we stretcher bearers found him just near the trench now held by the Germans, he was quite dead and we concluded he must have been killed by concussion as there were no marks about him. Idon't know if this is the man you means, as we know him as Tom, but there was only Tedford in A.Coy, so it must have been him. His brother W.Tedford is at present in England wounded. Both these men come from Maryborough Queensland.

Dear Sir,

Many thanks for your letter of the 20th September about 2012 P. 1. Tedford. It will I am sure mean a great deal to his relatives to hear on such reliable evidence that he was killed at once, and did not lie suffering in No Man's Land for hours.

I see by our Hospital Index that W. Tedford went to Perham Downs fit for duty on 18th August, and by this time he will probably be again with the battalion. He will no doubt have written home himself, but so many of the missing men have nobody to write to their people, and the Red Cross collects evidence about every Australian Soldier officially reported to be missing, and sends the information to Australia, so that relatives there may enquire at the bureau in the Capital of their State if they wish.
