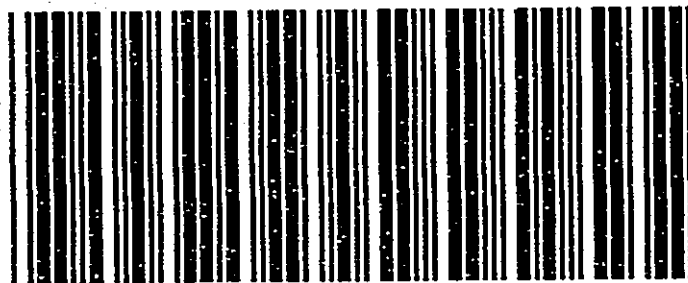

He came from Adelaide with me in the 4th to the 48th Reinforcements in the "Ballarat" on the 12th Aug. 1916. He came from the South East and was a farmer. I saw his body lying in the German 2nd line trench on the 11th Apl. 1917, early morning, daylight. We got the order from Capt. Mott to retire, and our dead and wounded were left behind.
