He was taken prisoner the night we were making an attack at Bullecourt We did not acqually see him taken prisoner, but during the attack quite a number of our men became surrounded of which he was one, and althoughtwe searched the ground, subsequentitoopushing the Germans back, no trace of any of them could be founded the read or alive so I feel certain he was taken prisoner.

I know him; he was first in cy Company and Platoon, but later on was transferred to D. Co. His initials the number are as stated. He went as batman to a Sergt., who later on got his Complexion. I knew nothing of him before he joined, but there was no other of that name in the Company. He were attacking at Bullcourt on Srd May, 1917, and had goined our objective. I was close by when Vellance was struck by a shell aplinter and killed outright. I saw him lying there; that trouch was never lost, but I cannot say if he was buried or not.
