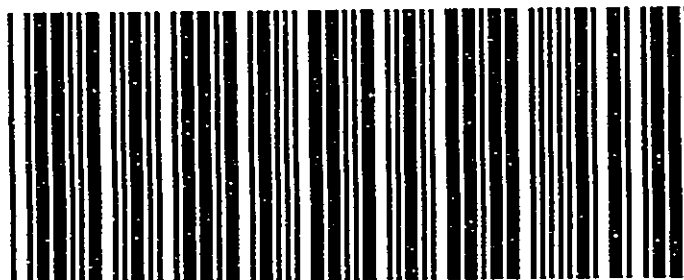

"Killed 16-5-18"

He was on ration fatigue with me on the night of Meteren about 300 yards behind the front line at I.a.m. about the middle of May 1918 when the Germans put up a barrage. He and Pte Fred Wanke 5th A.I.F. A.III took cover in a shelter and a shell fell just in front of it killing him outright. I saw his body about 10 minutes after. He was hit in many places. I saw the S/Bs also bring out Wanke who had been badly hit about the head, was unconscious and died on the way to the Dressing Station. Tuddenham was in A.Co III Platoon. was an original man and the only man of his name in the Battalion. He was tall and aged about 26, I have seen his grave and cross in the Military Cemetery at Borre.
