Re 1087 Pte.T.G.Perham, 51st Battn. He was admitted to this Hpl. on 16-4-18 from 7th Gen.Hpl., St. Omer, France, suffering from a severe exposure to Suffocating Poisonous Gas (enemy) which he received on 21-3-18. He had congestion of the lungs and died on 22-4-18 at 2-45 a.m. He is buried in the British Military Cemetery, Mt. Huon, France, near La Trepport, in Grave No. 836 A.

Dear Madam:

Private Perham was admitted to this Hospital on April 16th, 1918, from 7 General Hospital, St. Omer, France, suffering from a severe exposure to Suffocating Poisonous Gas (Enemy) which he received on March 21st, 1918. He had congestion of the lungs and died on April 22nd, 1918 at 9-45 AM.

Private Perham is buried in the British Military Cemetery, Mt. Ruon, France, near Le Treport, in Grave No. 836 A.
