

On looking through a note book that I was using during the Somme fighting of 1916, in the region of Posieres, I found an entry concerning one of my old Stretcher Bearers, that might be of value to your Eureau. At the time I was Regimental Medical Officer to the 14th Battalion.

On 27/8/16. I gave instructions that Mc.4984. Private Caborne, Stretcher Bearer, "D" Co., 14th Battalion should be buried by his comrades, near the Cemetery Pozieres. I believe that Capt. Tighe, R.C.Chaplain, 15th Battalion, administered the Last Communion before he died, but am not certain that his wife, Ruth Osborne, has been notified of these particulars.

I have made a note of her address, but it is almost obliterated, however, I can make out that the number of the house is 411, and that Ballarat is the City of her residence. There are 6 letters in the name of the street, the 3rd being L.

If there is any information not previously recorded, you will no doubt be able to get in touch with Hrs.Osborne, with little difficulty. If she would like me to write her personally I shall be only too pleased to do so.
