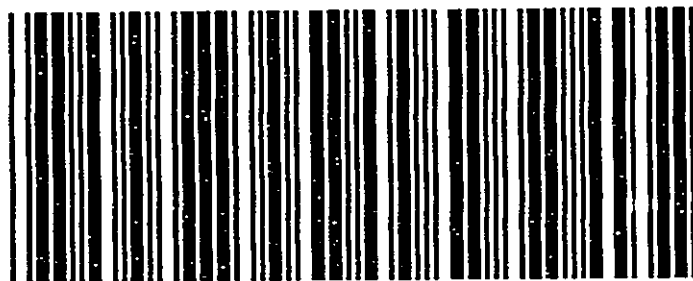

"Died of Wounds"

Re Pte.Templeton. He was admitted to this Station suffering from severe multiple shell wounds and in a critical condition. His condition did not improve and it is with regret I have to inform you of his death, which occurred at 11.0.a.m. on the morning of the 26.9.17 as a result of these wounds. He was buried the same day in the Soldiers' Cemetery near to this Hospital his grave being duly marked and registered.

Templeton was wounded in Ypres Sector, Polygon Wood, by shell fire being hit in both arms and in the throat. He was taken away and was delirious when I last saw him. I heard next day he had died of wounds.

Templeton was wounded going over the top on 26th at Polygon Wood, by a shell, part of which struck him in the throat. He went back to Coy. Hqts. I saw him wounded and heard he died, but do not know where, nor where he is buried.
