10th. F.A.B. I.G. L. 31426. A.I.F. "Died of Wounds 9-8-18." re the death and burial of the above soldier, I have to inform you that he died on admission to this Ambulance on

the 9th August, last, on account of shell wounds, his left foot being shattered.

He was buried in the Hilitary Cemetery on the out skirts of the village of LATOTER-en-Santerre, which

village is situated on the main Villers Bretonneux to

Peronne Rosa.

9/1918. Dets. D/B. D/a. August.

He was in the 38th. Battery and was wounded by one of our own shells which fell into a wood where we had our waggen lines. This was on August 9th. at a place just behind Morecourt near the Somme as you go up from Hamel. He was badly knocked about and was taken to an A.P. which was near by and then taken away by an Ambulance. I was helping to carry the next Stretcher to his on the way to the A.P. and could see him quite well. Afterwards I akandxfaxxkx asked his friends at the Battery and learnt from them that he had died of wounds. One of his friends was Corporal Q. Rayen, 10th. Brigade, 38th. Battery, who would. I am sure, be able to give more information, or the Orderly Room clerk of that battery. Warren was a chap of about 5 feet 8 or 9, rather fresh complexion, hair slightly ourly, he came. I think, from Newmarket, Melbourne, and his father was, I believe, a Policeman. I was with Warren once before when he was wounded He was a fine chap and I was very friendly with him. His follow gunners and war wall of him. speak very well of him.

We were book at the wagon lines resting, and had just finished breakfast when a shall fell. Werron was bedly hit, one foot being blown off. end also hit in the body. I being dearry him to the D/Station. I heard that he died in the C.C.S. at Mignacourt, and he is buried there.
