Informant says Webb was brought down into a German dug-out which the 28th had taken to wait for the Ambulance to take him to Hospital. Meanwhile the trench was re-taken by the enemy, and so far as informant knows Webb was not removed from the dug-out, so there is a possibility he may be a prisoner, or the Germans may have killed him. This was at Fleurz.

Informant states:--"The Germans attacked, and retook a trench on Nov: 14: 1916, between Guedecourt and Le Transloy. The stretcher bearers had put Pte. Webb in a dug out, as he had a broken leg, so when the Germans retook that trench, they must have taken Webb prisoner, for neither he, nor the wounded German with him were there when we again took the trench."
