I knew Quinlan very well and he came from NSW. On Sept 20th he was acting as company runner and during the attack on Westhoek Ridge he left Battrn H.Q. with a message for C.H.Q. He reached there and delivered his message and left to return but did not arrive. Taking all the circumstances into account there was only one conclusion to come to and that was that he had been hit by a shell and killed. There was no ground for thinking he was taken P/W as it all happened within our own lines. I can say nothing about burial
