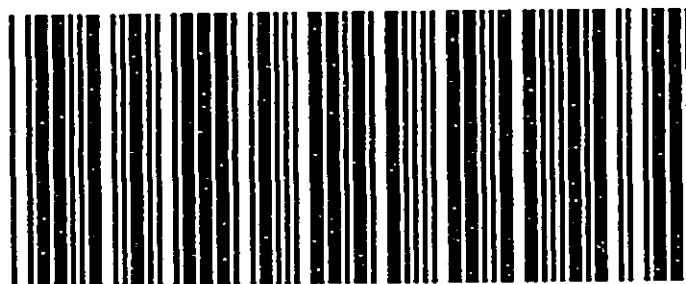

Informant described Trill as about 5 feet 7 inches high, slight build, dark complexion, aged about 35. Was called Simon. Informant believes that he directed portion of his pay to be given while he was on Active Service to a lady living in Market Street Sydney..

Informant states that they both belonged to B. Company, No. 6 Platoon. On 11/8/18 the Battalion was near Bayonvillers in action. They hopped over at 4 a.m. and about 4 minutes afterwards Trill was killed outright. Informant never saw this happen but later on in the day volunteered to go out for those killed and came across Trill lying alongside his gun. Another member of the gun team named Alf Lynch who has also been killed was lying next to Trill. Informant was present when Trill was buried in the open beyond Bayonvillers and the grave was marked for identification so that a cross could be put up later. Trill was Informant's best pal and was also well thought of by his other mates.
