

"Our battalion was at Plug St Wood on April 25th., and in the catacombs. I saw Roberts being carried back to the C.C.S. and later in the day, I called to see how he was progressing. I was told he had died that afternoon. A cemetery is just near the Dressing Station, and he is sure to have been buried there. We left Dressing Station, and he is sure to have been buried there we left Pristane together on the Pemosthenes, on April 17th'16, and knew each other quité well.

"Killed by Accident 25.4.17."

I saw him accidently wounded at Messines. The casualty happened whilst we were receiving instructions on the leading of Lewis M/o Gun and was caused through the insertion of live cartridges. instead of dummy ones. The bullets caught him in the legs and hody. He was taken to the dressing station about half-a-mile away, where I heard that he died. I do not know place of buriel and cannot refer to appone for further particulars:

I knew Ft. Mark Roberts of B. Co., VIII.Pltn. He was accidently killed in April 1917 by machine gun fire at the catacombs; he died at Steenworck and would be baried at the Cusualty Clearing Station Cemetery.

"Died of accidental Wounds 25.4.17"

I was his platoon Sgt. at the time of and his death was the result of an accident during a class in instruction in Lewis Guns by the Lewis Gun Corporal. During the working of the gun backwards and forwards a live shot which happened to be in the cartridge went off and shot Roberts in the thigh. The bullet was turned by the bone and penetrated the stomach causing very severe wounds. He was taken to the 56th C. C. Station at Steenwerke but died on the way there. He was buried in a very neat little cemetery immediately to the rear of Ploegsteert Wood and I believe the lads erected a cross over his grave. The cemetery is near the advanced dressing station near Hyde Fark Corner. A court of enquiry was held on the accident and the result given as Accidentally Killed. It appeared the charge was amongst the ammunition which had been tested and passed, but the shot went off on the second charge.

Pte. Roberts was killed accidentally by our own machine guna. Buried at the Font Nieppe Cemetery. A court of inquiry was held on this case proving it to have been purely accidental and the decision arrived at exonerated everyone from blame.
