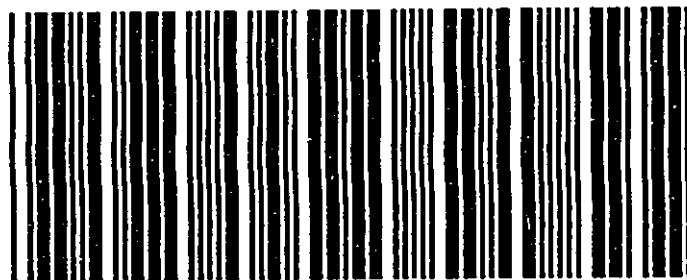

Witness states that he ~~saw~~^{knew} a man named Roberts on the Peninsula. He came from a place called Thirroul and was one of the original Btn not a Rft. He was killed at a well in Australia Gully. He was wounded in the head by shrapnel. Witness actually saw his dead body there. Roberts' mate, Pte J. Mulholland, now of D Co, 45th Btn, buried him and placed a cross over his grave. Witness is not sure of the initials or number of Roberts.

On 2nd May Informant saw Roberts (his tent-mate) apparently severely wounded, on the left of Pope's Hill at Dead Man's Ridge. He was taken off the Peninsula and had not returned up to 22nd August, when Informant left.

Informant states that on May 2nd at "Dead Man's Ridge" (Gallipoli) Pte Roberts was killed during a charge. Informant and five others went up the Ridge to cut barbed wire. Informant and Sergt Wise were the only two to get up the Ridge (the other four were killed), they stopped there and the whole Battn. followed. They held the Ridge through the night, but had to retire again on the 3rd May. Informant states that he feels certain that Pte Roberts must have been killed that night. They left about 100 dead on the Ridge, when they retired, and they were never able to get them afterwards. Informant know Pte Roberts very well as they were both in D. Coy, XVI Platoon, 13th Section. Informant saw a photograph of Pte Roberts in a paper and recognised it.
