I saw him going out of the line wounded in the thigh by a piece of shrapnel, he was a walking case. This was on the morning of October 4th 1917 at Zonnebeeke, while on the attack. About a week later the 26th Battn. got a letter from a Padre of another Btn (I do not know which Btn) that the Padres buried Schwartzrock and a L/Cpl. of 26th Btn at Sans-Sousi Ridge. Age about 26. Height about 5'9%, dark complexion, strong build.
