He was in C. Coy and was a Brigade runner. He was killed outright by a shell near the Sunken Road at Moreuil. Three or four others were killed by the same shell. I was clerk of the company and went up to get a casualty list and was shown his grave. I have given all information to his uncle Sgt Gray, who was with the Battalion recently.
