He was in C Co., 9th platoon. I saw his body early in the morning on the 20th July lying in "no mans land" just 10 yards over our trench near Fleurbaix. He had been killed outright by a shell. I could recognize him. I touched him and found him quite dead. He was tall, big, over 40, and came from Victoria.
