We received your letter of 27.6.17 in which you ask for news of your hashead No 1755 Pte.Clerence Powell, C.Coy, 59th Battalion, A.I.F.

We are very sorry indeed that we have no information to give you, except what you already know namely that he is officially reported Missing since 19.7.16. We have made every possible inquiry about him and we wish we could give you some hope of his being a prisoner but we fear that, as so long a time has elapsed since he was reported Missing, without any news being heard of him, there can now be very little doubt as to his fate.

His name has never been on any German list sent to us of Prisoners of War. We return the photograph you so kindly sent us as we fell you may like to have it back. You have our sincerest sympathy in your grief at the loss of your husband, who has so bravely sacrificed his life for his country.
