I knew them all. They were at Hill 60 on April 9th in an isolated sap about noonand should have been relieved at 2 o'clock but owing to the terrific German bembardment relief could not be sent. The sap was 50 yards from our line and before relief could be sent it was completely blown in and all in it were, as far as can be ascertained, killed. No bodies have been recovered. I was the tunnolling sgt. and responsible or the relief so I know they were there.
