

He was in A. Company, 3rd Platcon, 5ft.7ins, dark, stout built, and 20 years of age. I do not know what state he came from. I am not sure of the date, but I think it was on April 24th 1918 at about 10 p.m., We were attacking. He and I were members of at about 10 p.m., We were attacking. ## "Killed in Action 28-4-18"

He was in A.Company. 3rd Platoon. 5ft 7, dark, stout, and 20 years old. At Villers Bretonneux on April 24th 1918 at 10.p.m. we were attacking with a machine gun party when we encountered heavy machine gun fire from the Enemy. Phillips was killed instantly. We advanced and left him lying on the field dead. I know nothing of his burial
